GRADES: 3RD THROUGH 12TH



ARTS & COMMUNICATIONS: (Ideas) Modern Crafts, art, collections, hobbies, dance, sign language, creative writing, social media, music, (note this is a presentation not a performance opportunity)

PUBLIC SPEACKING: This can be any topic you would like. You will not have any props just speak.

FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCES: (Ideas) Parenting, preparing and/or following a budget, living space redesign, room makeovers, home safety, comparison shopping

HOSPITALITY, ETIQUETTE & SOCIAL GRACES: (Ideas) Introductions, proper places settings, cell phone etiquette, party/event planning, dining Do's and Don'ts, writing thank you notes, dressing for a social occasion, flag etiquette.



HEALTH & FITNESS: (Ideas) weight management and diet, exercise, fitness plans, asthma, child abuse, eating disorders, CPR training, cancer
